

## **AUXILIARY SERVICES — Series 700**

### **701 Nutrition Program**

#### **701.1 Purpose and Scope of Program**

The school district will operate a school lunch and breakfast program in each attendance center. The nutrition program services will include hot lunches through participation in the National School Lunch Program and supplementary foods for students during the school day. Students may bring their lunches from home and purchase milk or juice and other incidental items.

School food service facilities are provided to serve students and employees when school is in session and during school-related activities. They may also be used under the supervision of the superintendent for food service to employee groups.

The school food program is operated on a nonprofit basis. The revenues of the school food program will be used only for paying the regular operating costs of the school food program. Supplies of the school food program shall only be used for the school food program.

Children deposit money into their school meal account as needed at the office of the building level secretary. When a student's account is in arrears more than \$10, the student may be denied a full meal. The student will be provided a sandwich and milk at a cost of 50 cents until the account shows a positive balance.

The board will set, and periodically review, the prices for school lunches, breakfast and special milk programs. It shall be the responsibility of the superintendent to make a recommendation regarding the prices of school lunch, breakfast and milk.

It shall be the responsibility of nutrition supervisor to administer the program and to cooperate with the superintendent for the proper functioning of the school food program. The central administration staff in cooperation with the building level secretaries will handle all financial and pupil accounting requirements and prepare reports and other record keeping duties of the department.
