Draw someone in your house (or yourself) from observation. Add a background that tells a story about your subject.	Photograph your name by using items that look like the letters.	Look up Andy Goldsworthy. Go outside and find leaves, dirt, rocks and make land art. Arrange things in nature and take a photo.	Use tin foil and sculpt a person or animal.	Research how to make your own pigments (paint color) from plant or vegetable matter. Make your own pigment, then create an artwork from it.
Make a face mask from paper, old clothes, or cardboard. Draw something on it to make it silly or serious.Take a pic of someone wearing it.	Carve or sculpt with food. You can carve into something or use toothpicks to combine things to make a sculpture.	Use cardboard, old mail, or paper and build a house at least 6" tall. Include windows and doors. Beach house, bird house, dream house	COVID-19 is changing our world overnight and it is very surreal. Create a piece that captures your feelings and thoughts in this moment in history.	Research "Pop-Art" or "Op-Art". Make an artwork that fits within that movement.
Use rolled up paper to make an abstract sculpture. Use glue.	Make a phone holder out of cardboard or anything you can think of. Please be creative!	FREE SPACE	Make a paper chain and write positive thoughts on it. Hang it somewhere for other people to see and take a pic of it hanging.	Make a layered landscape with paper, cardboard or cereal box cardboard. Color each layer a different color if needed. At least 4 layers.
Make an insect sculpture from whatever you want to use. Cardboard, wire, paper, tin can etc. It must be 3-D.	Make a new game or an original checkerboard with game pieces. Play the game. Take pics.	Research origami and make 3 origami creations.	Research Alexander Calder. Use sticks or a wire hanger and make a mobile with any materials you want.	Make a bouquet of paper flowers. Include a vase either made or found.
Design a package to make customers want to buy something silly like one lima bean, a rock, bag of sand, smiles include description, picture and price of the item on your box.	Make a plate of food. You can use a real plate, paper plate or make a plate. Make the food from paper or cardboard. Think about silverware and drink.	Practice drawing your hand from multiple perspectives in multiple positions. Look on YouTube if you need help. Create a finished artwork based on what you've learned.	Make a picture frame out of whatever you want. It has to be big enough for your face to fit in it. Take pictures with someone inside the picture frame.	Make a colorful animal from paper, old mail, or cardboard.
