WBCSD is excited to announce that we purchased two new buses that are fully equipped with lap shoulder belts (seatbelts). **ALL** passengers are required to wear them. Please take a minute to talk with your children. Even if they do not normally ride the bus they will probably ride one for field trips. The new buses are currently used on Bambi Simpson's and Dave Rozinek's routes.

Current Pick-up and Drop-off Information

You will be receiving an email indicating your route assignment and approximate pick-up and drop-off times by August 17th.

Bus routes have a set order for pick-up and drop-off of students to ensure efficiencies. As new students or families are added, these times are subject to slight changes. As you know, weather-related issues might cause slight delays due to road conditions.

Please Note: Please be respectful of school start times. Students should at their designated "bus stops" **5 minutes in advance** of the established pick-up time. **If students are not at their designed "bus stop," drivers will give a visual review of the area and continue on for the sake of all learners. Please be sure students are dressed appropriately for the weather conditions.*

Bus Routes for 2020-21 School Year

New this year! Please fill out the [WBCSD Student Online Bus Request](#) for your child/children.

This year, we will be emailing out a letter indicating your route assignment and approximate pick-up and drop-off times by August 17th. We will also include additional information pertinent to riding a bus.

Bus #13 – Bob Cahill, driver

This route begins southeast of Rochester then proceeds to west Rochester, north of 290th St. and West Branch.

Bus #12- West Branch Mobile Village is now divided into 2 different buses. Bus #1 and Bus #20

Bus #1 – Wayne Mertens, driver

This route will now include the north part of the West Branch Mobile Village, northeast of West Branch and proceeds to Cedar Valley south to 280th St.

Bus #19 – Dave Rozinek, driver

This route operates in the northwest area of the district and includes Rapid Creek Rd. This route will also include Bickford Dr. and Greenview.

The bus will stop at 109 Bickford Dr., 133 Bickford Dr., and 166 Bickford Dr.

Bus #2 – Tim Crew, driver

This route includes the southwest section of the district that includes Diltsville, Herbert Hoover Hwy. Oasis, and 400th St., Wapsi Ave., Lower West Branch Rd. and 420th St.

Bus #27 – Jeff Arp, driver

This route covers the area south of I-80, Centerdale, Scattergood, Downey and West Liberty truck stop, KOA and Springdale.

Bus # 20 – Bambi Simpson, driver

This route covers one stop in Oasis, Greenview Circle, 290th St., Oliphant St., Pheasant Run, the south part of the West Branch Mobile Village, and one stop on Wapsi Ave.

Bus Privileges, Requirements, Rules and Safety Considerations

In addition, in order for students to ride a bus to another student's home, parents / guardians must provide:

- 1) Written and / or verbal permission to the school office at least two hours before the end of a school day.
- 2) Upon approval, the school office will provide the classroom teacher with a signed permission slip to be handed to the student(s) to give to the bus driver with pertinent safety information.

IMPORTANT: The District is very concerned about student safety. The use of cellular phones by drivers **while** transporting students is prohibited. Direct communication by parents to bus drivers through the use of cellular phones (during transporting times) is prohibited. *Pertinent information regarding your student(s) riding should be communicated with the Transportation Director who will then forward the information to the drivers via the bus radio system.* The use of cellular phones by our drivers is for emergency communications only.

Hard Surface Routes (Weather-Related Topics)

We appreciate the parents helping us out when gravel roads become dangerous for buses. There will be specific stops along these safety routes where parents can meet the buses. Buses will pause for several minutes at each stop to ensure parents can get their children to the designated stops. This information will be communicated via our School Connects information system for all weather needs. In the event that we need to use Hard Surface Routes, please reference this list. Re: Hard Surface Routes for 2020-21 School Year

Winter will become a factor as we transport students to and from school. During these months, Iowa weather can be very uncooperative. More storms with snow and ice are inevitable in the winter months and will raise our level of concern for bus travel.

Knowing the Iowa winters can be very unpredictable, it may be wise to be prepared for gravel roads that could become difficult for travel. Last year the West Branch CSD utilized a system of safety routes for buses. Our transportation department has once again designed a series of safety routes to be utilized in these times.

We appreciate parents helping us out when gravel road become dangerous for buses. There will be specific stops along these safety routes where parents can meet the buses. Buses will pause for several minutes at each stop to ensure parents can get their children to the designated stops.

Bus #13 – Bob Cahill, driver: Begins southeast of Rochester then proceeds to west Rochester, KOA, Springdale and West Branch.

Bus #1 – Wayne Mertens, driver: Begins northeast of West Branch and proceeds to Cedar Valley south to 280th St. and the north part of West Branch Mobile Village.

Bus #12 – Now divided between Bus #1 and Bus #20.

Bus #19 – Dave Rozinek, driver: Operates in the northwest area of the district. This route will also include Bickford Dr. and Greenview. *The bus will stop at 109 Bickford Dr., 133 Bickford Dr. and 166 Bickford Dr.*

Bus #2 – Tim Crew, driver: Includes the southwest section of the district that includes Herbert Hoover Hwy. to Wildwood and back.

Bus #4 – Jeff Arp, driver: Covers the area south of I-80, to Downey and back to West Branch.

Bus # 20 – Bambi Simpson, driver: Covers one stop in Oasis, Greenview Circle, 290th St., Pheasant Run, Oliphant St., south part of West Branch Mobile Village, and one stop on Wapsi Ave.

Re: Bus Riding Privileges and Rider's Responsibilities

The following policies and rules are in effect at the West Branch Schools. We want student riders and their parents to have a great school year. This information is furnished so that all may know our policies and what is expected. Your help and cooperation is requested and appreciated. Questions should be directed to the Bus Barn at 643-5325.

Board Policies:

702.02 Eligibility for Bus Service

. . . A student's right to be transported on the public school bus may be denied if the student's conduct is unacceptable to the bus driver and administration.

702.07 Student Conduct on School Transportation

Students utilizing school transportation shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner fitting to their age level and maturity with mutual respect and consideration for the rights of the school vehicle driver and the other passengers. Students who fail to behave in an orderly manner will be subject to disciplinary measures.

The driver shall have the authority to maintain order on the school vehicle. It shall be the responsibility of the driver to report misconduct to the parents, transportation supervisor, and then to the administrator. It shall be the responsibility of the driver to report misconduct to the parent first by completing the designated forms. Should the incident not get resolved, the transportation supervisor will assist in the resolution. If the incident is still not resolved, the building principal will be notified, with the original report and the resolution attempts.

Parents are responsible for supervision until such time as the child boards the bus and after the child leaves the bus at the end of the school day and are responsible to help school officials enforce rules for a safe and orderly environment on the bus.

Violation of bus rules will be considered sufficient cause for refusing to transport the student(s) involved, and may lead to suspension from school, depending upon the seriousness of the matter.

Rules for Continued Use of School Transportation Privilege

The bus driver shall have complete control of the bus and the students he/she is transporting for the duration of the bus ride. To eliminate discipline problems and vandalism on the bus fleet, the following rules will be strictly enforced:

All students will conduct themselves in an orderly manner. ***Minor behavior violations include: hitting, spitting, profanity, out of seat, throwing objects, improper boarding/unloading from bus, failure to follow directions of driver, obstructing aisles, making loud noises, hanging out windows, food & beverage violation, disrespect for driver and improper discarding of trash.***

If any of the above minor violations occur, the following discipline will result:

1. A written notice will be sent to the parents after the first (1st) offense.
2. After the second (2nd) offense, the student will be taken off the bus for three (3) days.
3. After the third (3rd) offense, the student will be removed from the bus for a minimum of one week and will be asked to meet with the transportation director and building principal.
4. If removal from the bus would result in the student not attending school, an alternate consequence will be assigned by the principal; however, bus behavior must improve in order to maintain the privilege of riding.
5. For students with behavioral disabilities, an individual plan will be developed.
6. It is expected that prior to written warnings, or in addition to, drivers will have administered bus discipline such as assigned seats.

The following offenses will result in immediate removal from the bus:

1. ***Vandalism***
2. ***Fighting***
3. ***Insubordination***
4. ***Possession of dangerous object***
5. ***Possession of tobacco, alcohol or other drugs***
6. ***Founded bullying behaviors or patterns of bullying other students***

702.10 Bus Stops

Student should be at their designated bus / transportation pick-up location 5 minutes before their listed / regularly scheduled pick-up time.

No bus shall leave the public highway to receive or discharge students unless using a private drive or road as a turn-around enhances safety. The bus drivers are expected to use their bus judgment to ensure the safety of the children and the bus in inclement weather.

A bus shall not stop to load or unload students unless the driver has an unobstructed view of at least 300 feet in each direction under normal weather conditions.

It shall be the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide an all-weather turn-around for a bus, if necessary for efficiency or safety.

Note:

Please let us know if your son or daughter will not be riding the bus. If transportation is needed at a later date, your need will be met. This cooperative effort will help save time and energy.
